Brown County Commission Chambers, 25 Market Street, Aberdeen, South Dakota, June 4, 2009, 4:00 p.m., Special City Council Meeting to canvas election results. ## RESOLUTION NO. 09-06-01 R

Campbell moved, Hodgins seconded to approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 09-02-02 R passed and adopted on February 2, 2009, the City Council of the City of Aberdeen set the time and date for the Annual Municipal Election to be held in the City on June 2, 2009 for the purpose of electing a Mayor and a City Council Member for the NW District and

WHEREAS, at the Annual Municipal Election held in the several polling places in the City of Aberdeen, South Dakota on Tuesday, June 2, 2009, there were cast the following votes for Offices of Mayor and Council Member of the City of Aberdeen, to wit: Mayor five-year term: Tom Burgard – 510, David Bunsness – 1,187, Clint Rux – 405, Mike Levsen – 1,445, there being a total of 3,547 legal ballots cast for Mayor of the City of Aberdeen; City Council Member for NW District, five-year term: Jennifer Slight-Hansen – 346, Roland Walter – 251, Heath Johnson – 320, there being a total of 917 legal ballots cast for Council Member, NW District, and

WHEREAS, the returns of said election have been delivered and canvassed by the City Council, and

WHEREAS, Mike Levsen and Jennifer Slight-Hansen received a plurality of the legal votes cast,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN, that Mike Levsen is hereby elected Mayor for a term of five years, Jennifer Slight-Hansen is hereby elected NW District Council Member for a term of five years, and the City Finance Officer is hereby directed to issue the proper Certificates of Election.
